# Council propose 5% reduction to Community Grant Funding

**DUP and UUP Councillors have voted in favour of a 5% reduction to the money allocated by Causeway Coast and Glens Council to community grant programmes for 2020/21.**

#### Causeway Community News

The vote took place during Tuesday evening's full council meeting.  
In a social media post last night Councillor Ashleen Schenning said: 'Totally disgusted tonight as Causeway Coast and Glens council voted for 5% reduction to the revenue allocation from council funding contribution to the annual grants programme 20-21. It was hoped there would be a change of heart at full council.'

restore a £750,000 community capital grant fund whilst council projects such as play parks for special needs children languish on the drawing board. This fund could cost council £90,000 per year for 10 years.

'It would be easy to say that the proposals by SDLP and Sinn Fein were merely to chase cheap headlines in an election campaign but given the sums of money involved in the headlines were anything but cheap.'

However, a Council employee who didn't want to be identified said: 'There is a black hole in Council finances.'

'As an employee, I think it is rich that Councillors and Officers are making small cuts to try and re-coup their losses, when it was the

Councillors who struck a zero per cent rate for three years without taking into account wages increases, insurance costs, fuel costs, heating and energy increases.

'Now when the chips are down, they expect those of us who had no part to play in creating this financial deficit, to carry the burden.'

'Councillors need to take cuts too. They should stop claiming allowances, that would help. Both Councillors and Officers should look at downsizing their major wage earners, and their "glossy" projects. That would soon bring down their short-fall, not cuts to the lower-paid and services', she said, adding: 'it's not all about empty bins and clean streets!'

## Men force entry into Coleraine home

**POLICE received a report that three men had forced entry to a house in the Lisnablagh Road area of Coleraine on Tuesday, December 3.**

#### Causeway Coast Community

The men entered the property at around 7.40pm and told the female occupant, a woman in her 70's, that they were there to deal with youths involved with drugs. Upon realising there were no youths present they apologised to the woman and left.

The woman was not injured by the men, however, damage was caused to the door-frame of the house as a result of the incident.

Officers have asked anyone who noticed any suspicious activity in the area or anyone with information to contact them in Coleraine on 101 quoting reference number 1646 03/12/19.

Alternatively, information can also be provided to the independent charity **CRIMESTOPPERS** on **0800 555 111** which is 100% anonymous and gives people the power to speak up and stop crime.

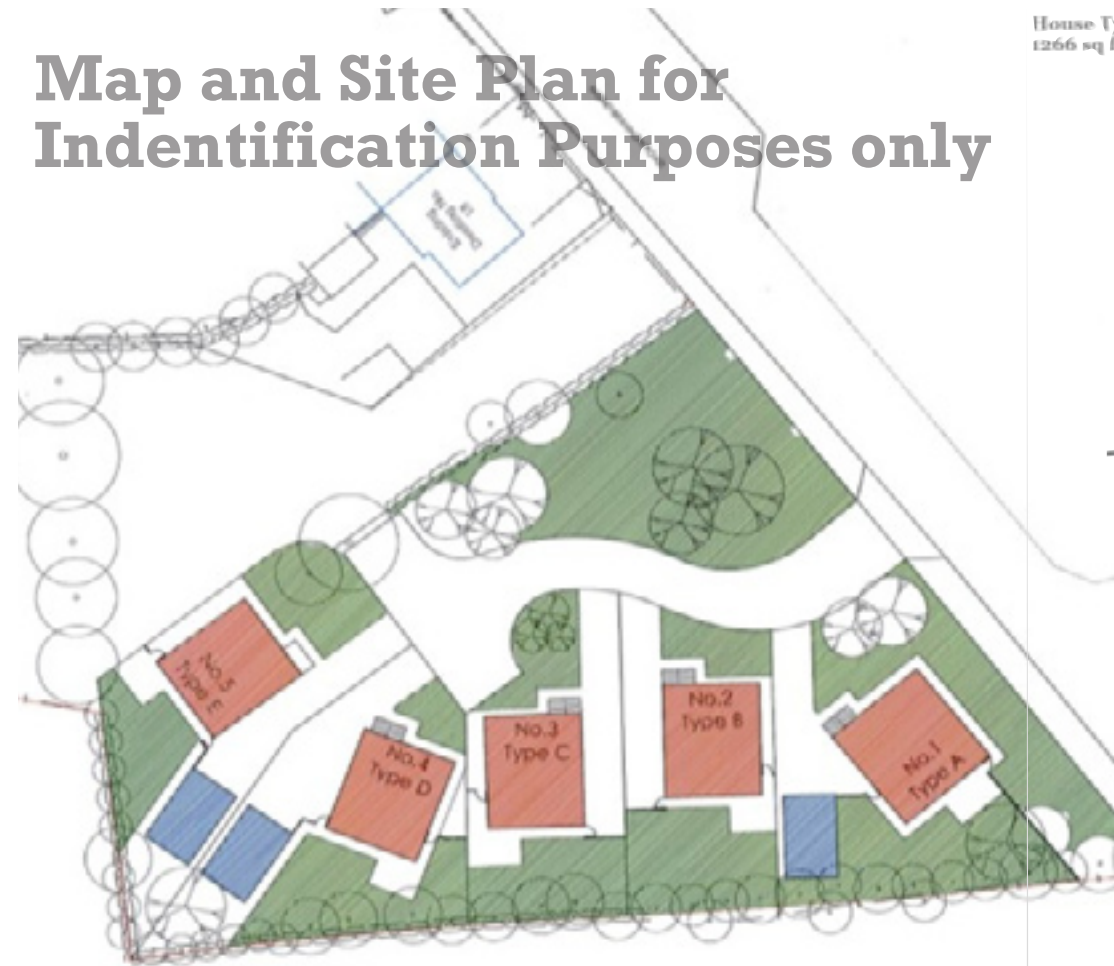

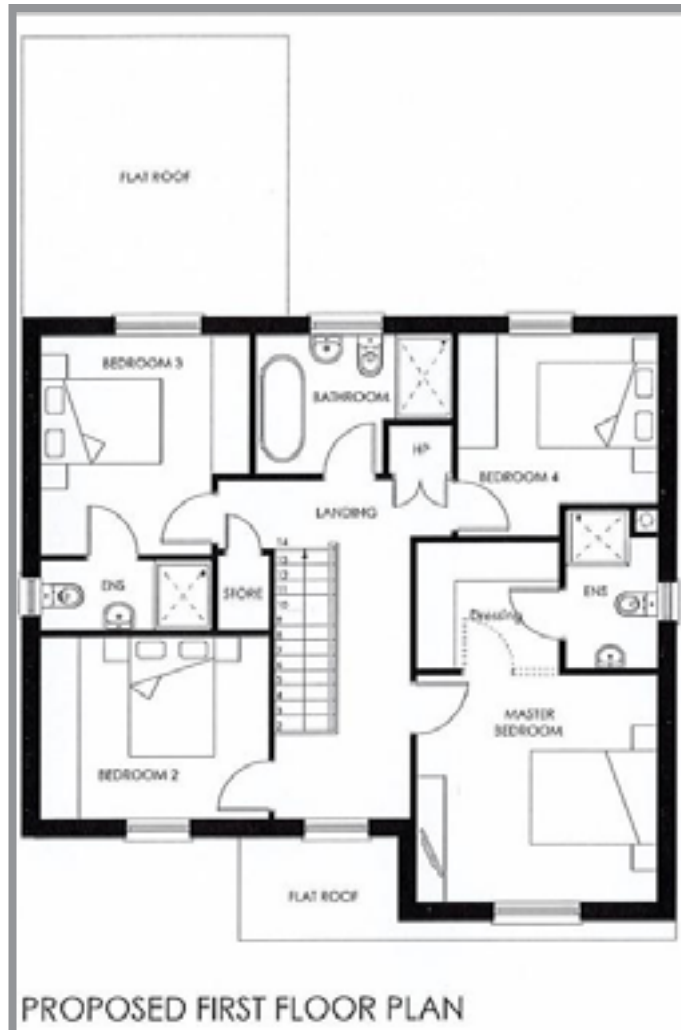

CAMPBELL PRESSES FOR PAY DISPUTE TO BE RESOLVED . . .

# Get it sorted . . .

**GREGORY CAMPBELL** attended today's picket line in support of Unison at the Causeway Hospital.

Mr. Campbell said: "Those who work in our NHS need to be supported, I and my colleagues were delighted to do that on Friday."

"There is much more needed in that a commitment from the Northern Ireland Secretary of State has to ensure that the ongoing shortfall which is currently required, around £20/£25 million is found. This would help in the immediate crisis, but

the long term solution for NHS patients and staff is for a return of Stormont where a Health Minister can begin that longer term process to ensure we don't have another series of problems such as we are all faced with now.

Bradley was speaking after he met with Causeway Hospital staff on the picket line outside the hospital on Friday morning.

"I have the utmost respect for all of our hospital staff," said Bradley. "NHS staff are highly skilled professionals who work in very difficult conditions, they deserve decent pay in line with their colleagues in the rest of the United Kingdom. There should be no difference in pay

for NHS staff – it is the National Health Service - serving patients across the United Kingdom – in Northern Ireland, England, Wales and Scotland – no NHS staff in any of these regions should be getting any more or any less than others.

"I stand with our healthcare staff here in Northern Ireland – they do a great job in often very challenging situations. Our NHS staff are worth their weight in gold and they should be remunerated accordingly."

Bradley went on to describe the banking system currently in place within the health trusts as 'morally wrong'.

He said: "Again we see discrepancies in pay depending on what Nursing Guild you trained in."

"Doctors and consultants are getting paid extortionate amounts of money to cover unfilled posts – surely if they were offered decent salaries, reflective of the lifesaving work that they do, then the number of vacant posts within the health service would be minimal, and nurses and doctors would want to stay here in Northern Ireland to work instead of moving to other parts of the United Kingdom where their pay would be higher."

The MLA went on: "The DUP are ready to go back to Stormont to set up an Assembly tomorrow."

"We need a functioning Executive not just to sort out the healthcare crisis here, for our schools, for our elderly, for everyone in Northern Ireland."

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council is keen to examine how the transition of the current energy system and regulatory changes taking place in the electricity market could impact local organisations and residents.

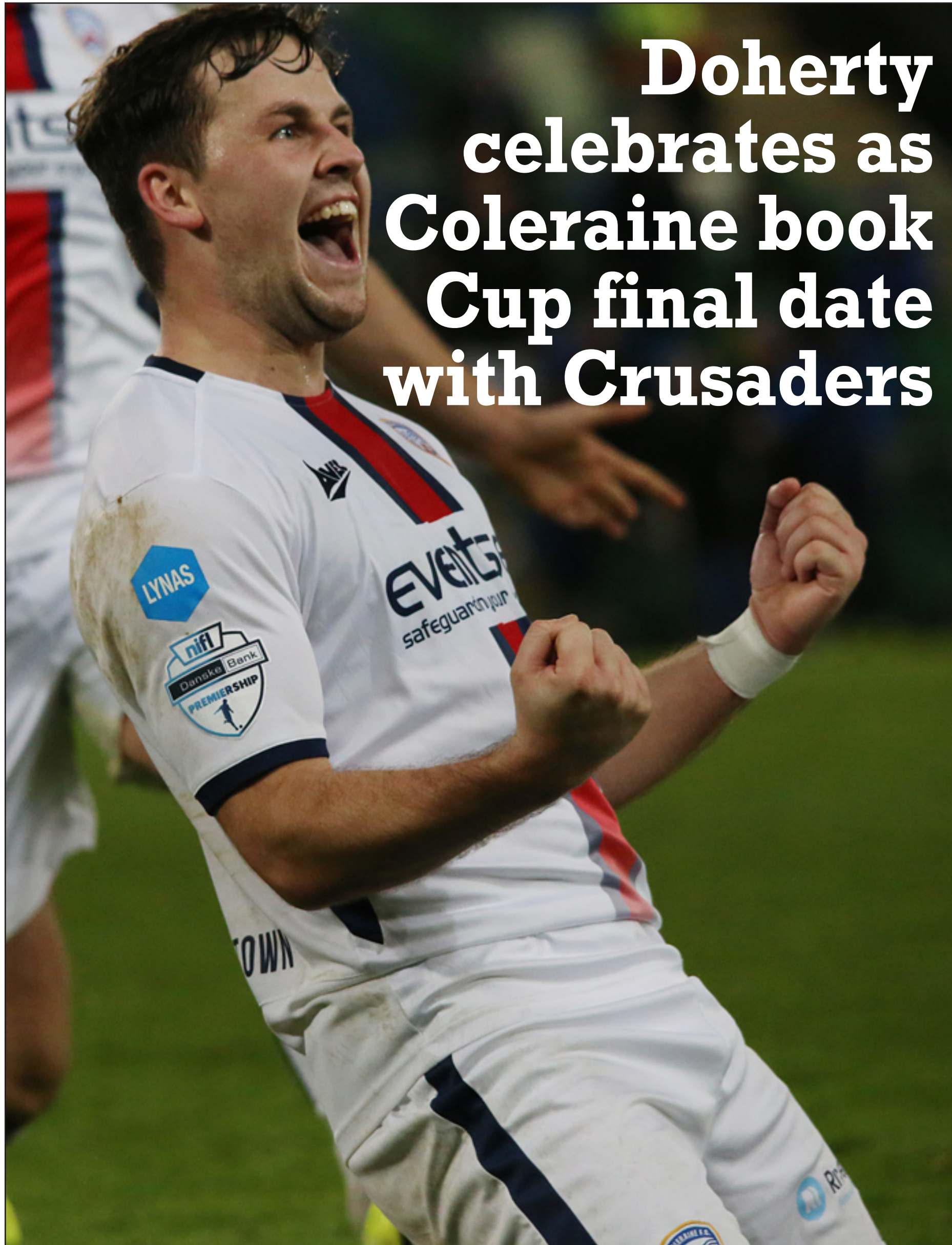

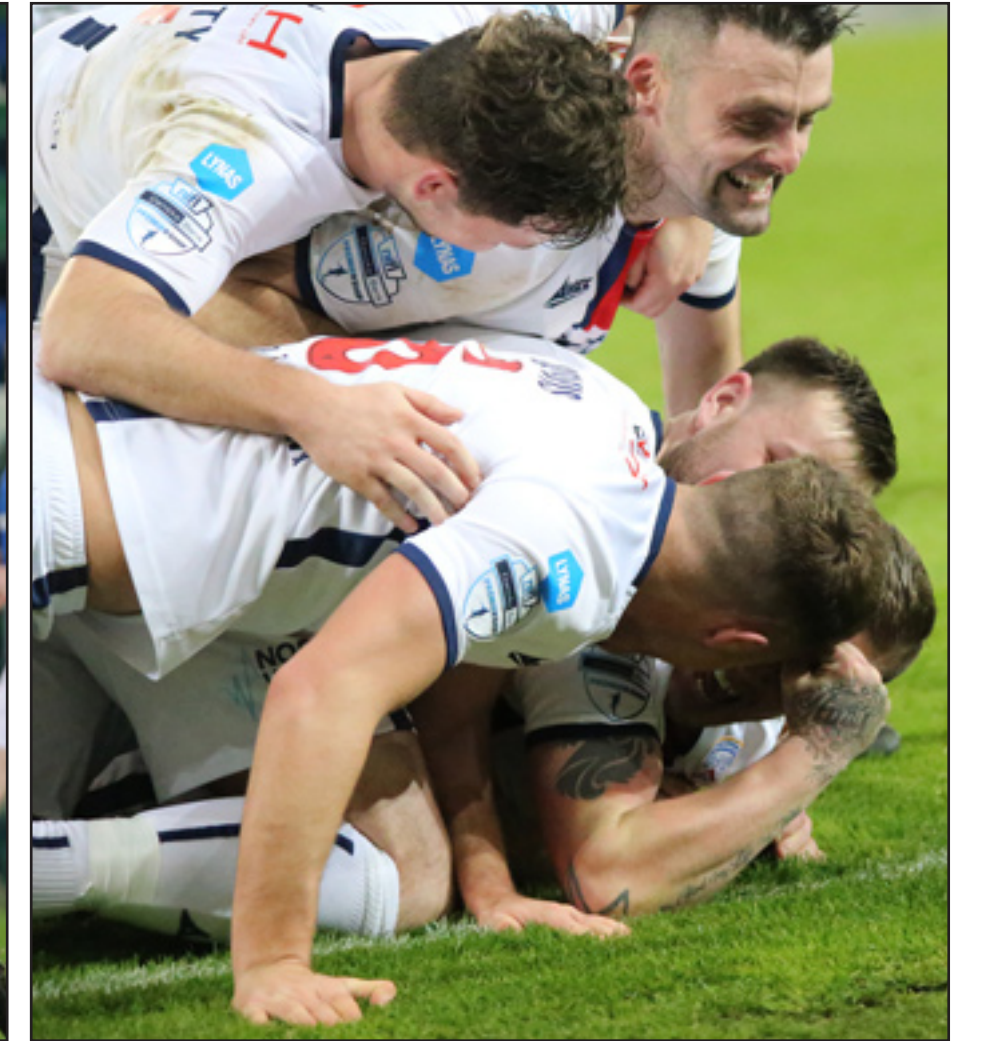
